Integrated Methods

• Literature (all grades)

Grades 1–3 have their books read to them. Grades 4–12 read their books for themselves.

- Oral Narration (all grades) Naturally includes reading comprehension. Preparation and practice for composition.
- Written Narration / Composition (grades 4–12) Naturally includes reading comprehension. Basis for composition guidance.
- Practice Reading Aloud (all grades, as ready)
 Grades 1–3 practice as they learn to read (beginning reading).

• Copywork and Transcription (grades 1-3)

Includes capitalization, punctuation, spelling. Reinforces good writing style and English grammar.

• Poetry (all grades)

Includes rhymes, memorization, and recitation.
